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## Double Irish Chain Quilt

54" x 54" Throw Size

Read through the entire pattern before starting. All seams are $1 / 4$. ."
Besides the quilt on the cover, there are 2 more designs ideas for you to consider.
Enjoy this fun and easy traditional block, Double Irish Chain. The design is made from two blocks. You'll want to make 12 Four Corners Blocks and 13 Double Irish Chain Blocks to make this 54" square throw quilt.

## Variations

The Double Irish Chain has been a quilter's favorite for centuries. Published in the Ladies Art Company in 1897, this historic quilt design may be an oldie, but is loved by both modern and traditional quilters today. Enjoy the many variations of this block. ## Lisa's Variation



For a modern spin on a traditional block, split your greens into lime and cool blue greens. Lay the colors out like the example squares.

## Four Corners Block - Unfinished Size $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## For Twelve Four Corners Blocks, Cut:

$12-6 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares from light fabrics (white)
$48-6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from light fabrics (white)


Make 12 blocks $101 / 2{ }^{1}$ unfinished size
$48-2 \frac{112 "}{}$ squares from medium fabrics (green) OR 24 Lime and 24 Blue-green squares

## Piecing Instructions

1. Sew a $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " square to each end of a $61 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 2 \frac{112 "}{}$ rectangle. Press seams toward the darker fabric. Make 24 units.

2. Sew a $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the left and right sides of the $61 / 2$ " square. Press seams toward the square. Make 12 units.


## Double Irish Chain Block - Unfinished Size $101 / 2{ }^{1}$

## For Thirteen Double Irish Chain Blocks, Cut:

$52-21 / 2{ }^{1 \prime}$ squares from light fabrics (white)
$117-21 / 2$ " squares from dark fabrics (charcoal)
$156-21 / 2$ " squares from medium fabrics (green) Or 78 Lime and 78 Blue-green squares

## Refer to your preferred design on pages 1 or 2 for color placement.

## Piecing Instructions

1. Position four light (white), nine dark (black), and twelve medium (green) $21 / 2$ " squares like the diagram below.
2. Sew the squares into columns. Press seams in alternate directions as the arrows indicate.
3. Align, nest seams, pin, and sew the units from step 1 to the top and bottom of the block units from step 2. Press seams as indicated by the arrows. Block should measure $101 / 2$ square. Make 12 blocks.


4. Align, nest seams, pin, and sew the columns together. Press the seams toward the center as the arrows indicate. Block should measure 10 ½" square. Make 13 blocks.


## Quilt Top Assembly Instructions

## Refer to your preferred design on pages 1 or $\mathbf{2}$ for block placement.

1. Arrange the blocks like the diagram.
2. Align, pin, and sew the blocks in rows. Press the seams to one side as the arrows indicate.
3. Align, nest seams, pin, and sew the rows together. Press seams in one direction. Press well. Quilt top should measure $501 / 2$ " square.

## For Border Cut:

$8-21 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips
4. Trim selvage from ends. Sew two strips end to end. Press seam to one side. Make four strip sets.
5. If your quilt top measured $501 / 2$ ", trim two strips to $501 / 2$ "and two strips to $541 / 2$ ".

Lisa's Tip:
Fold the strip at the seam. Divide $50 \frac{1}{2}$ " by two $=25^{1 / 4}$." Measure from the seam $25^{11 / 4}$. Trim off the excess. Unfolded, it will be 50 12."


If your quilt top did not measure $501 / 2$ ", cut two strips to your measurement, and two strips at that measurement plus $4^{\prime \prime}$.
6. Pin and sew the $501 / 2$ " strips to the left and right sides. Press seams toward the border strips.
7. Pin and sew the $541 / 2$ " strips to the top and bottom. Press seams toward the border strips.
8. Quilt as desired, label, and bind.
