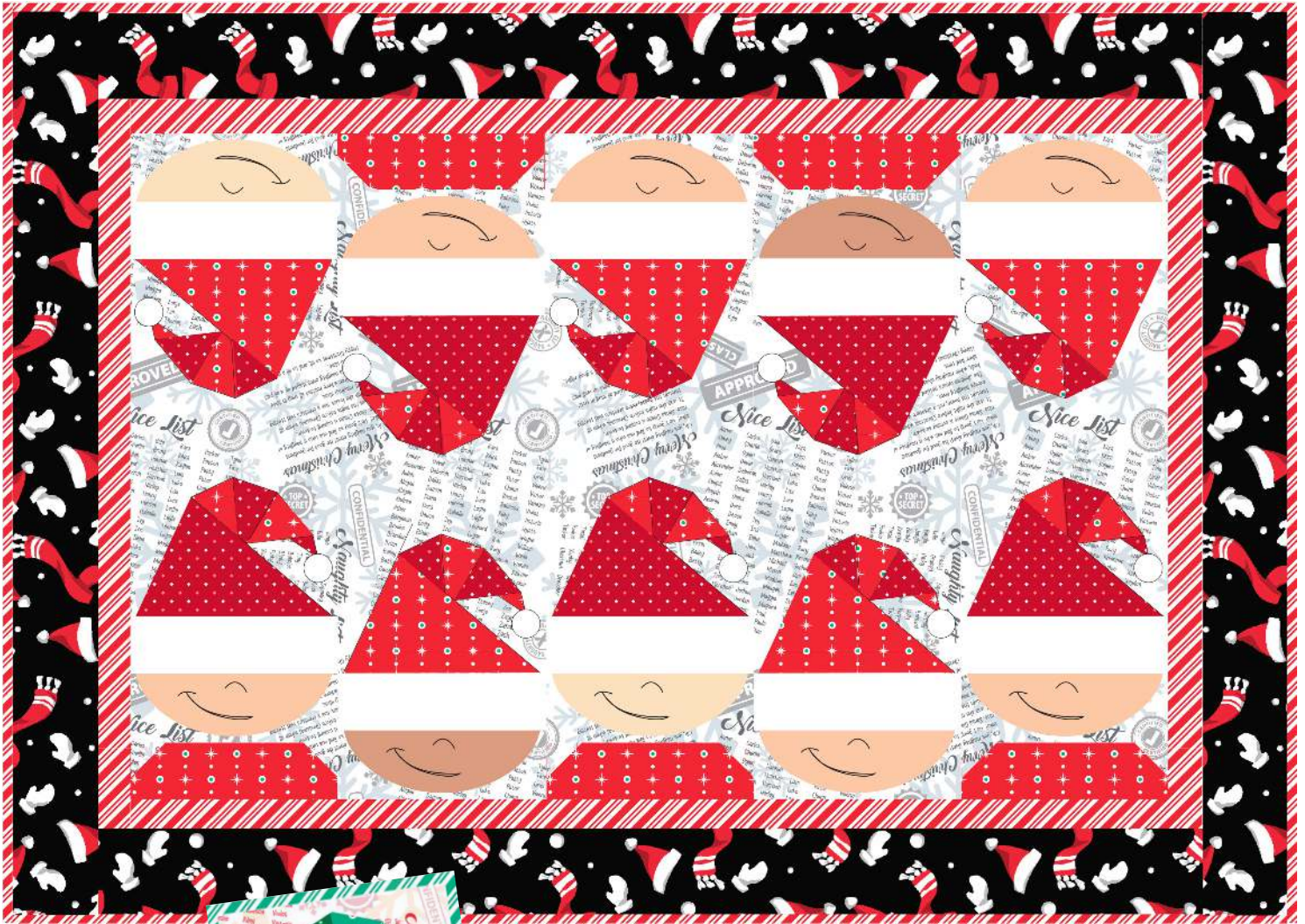

 <p>R590347D Red - ⅔ yard</p>	<p>Five 2" x 6 ½" rectangles for shoulders            Remainder for Ten paper-pieced hats</p>
 <p>R590348D Red - ½ yard</p>	<p>Two 30 ½" x 1 ½" rectangles for inner border            Two 21 ½" x 1 ½" rectangles for inner border            Three 2 ½" x WOF for binding</p>
 <p>R590349D Red - ⅔ yard</p>	<p>Ten Paper-pieced hats</p>

## Naughty Elf Mug Rug, 6" x 8"

### Cutting Instructions for one Naughty Elf Mug Rug

#### Background - Gray Naughty List [R590350D]

- One 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle for face appliqué
- One 2" x 1" rectangle for #6
- One 2 ½" x 6" rectangle for #8
- One 3" x 6" rectangle for #11
- One 4" x 2" rectangle for #1
- One 3 ½" x 2" rectangle for #7
- One 4" x 2" rectangle for #9

#### Hat - Red Garland [R590347D]

- One 2" x 1 ½" rectangle for #2
- One 3" x 2" rectangle for #4
- One 7" x 4 ½" rectangle for #10

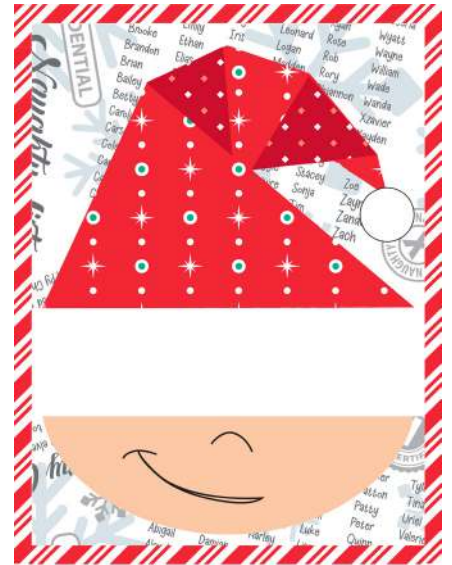
#### Hat - Red Diamonds [R590349D]

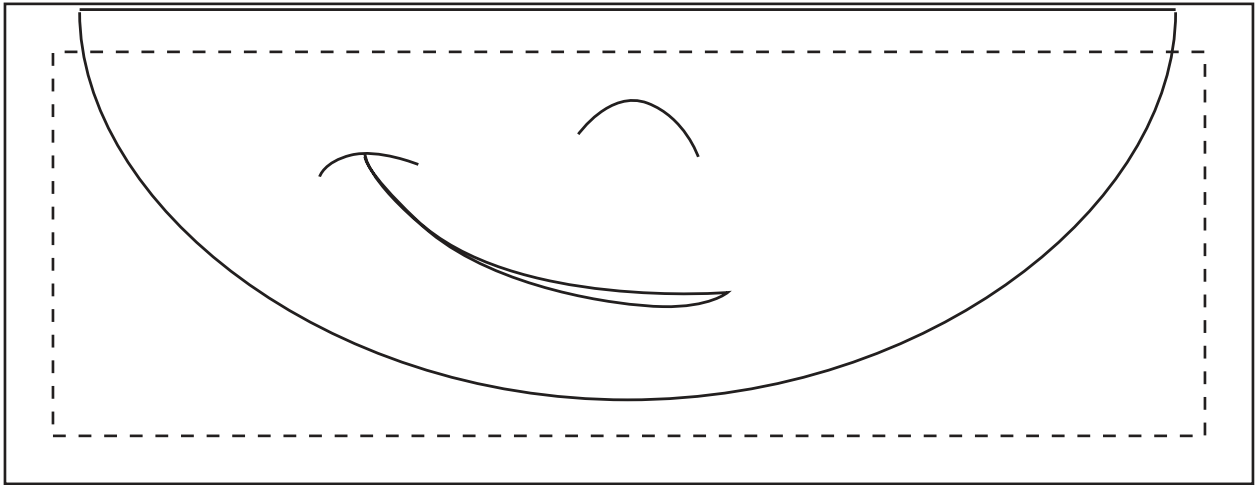
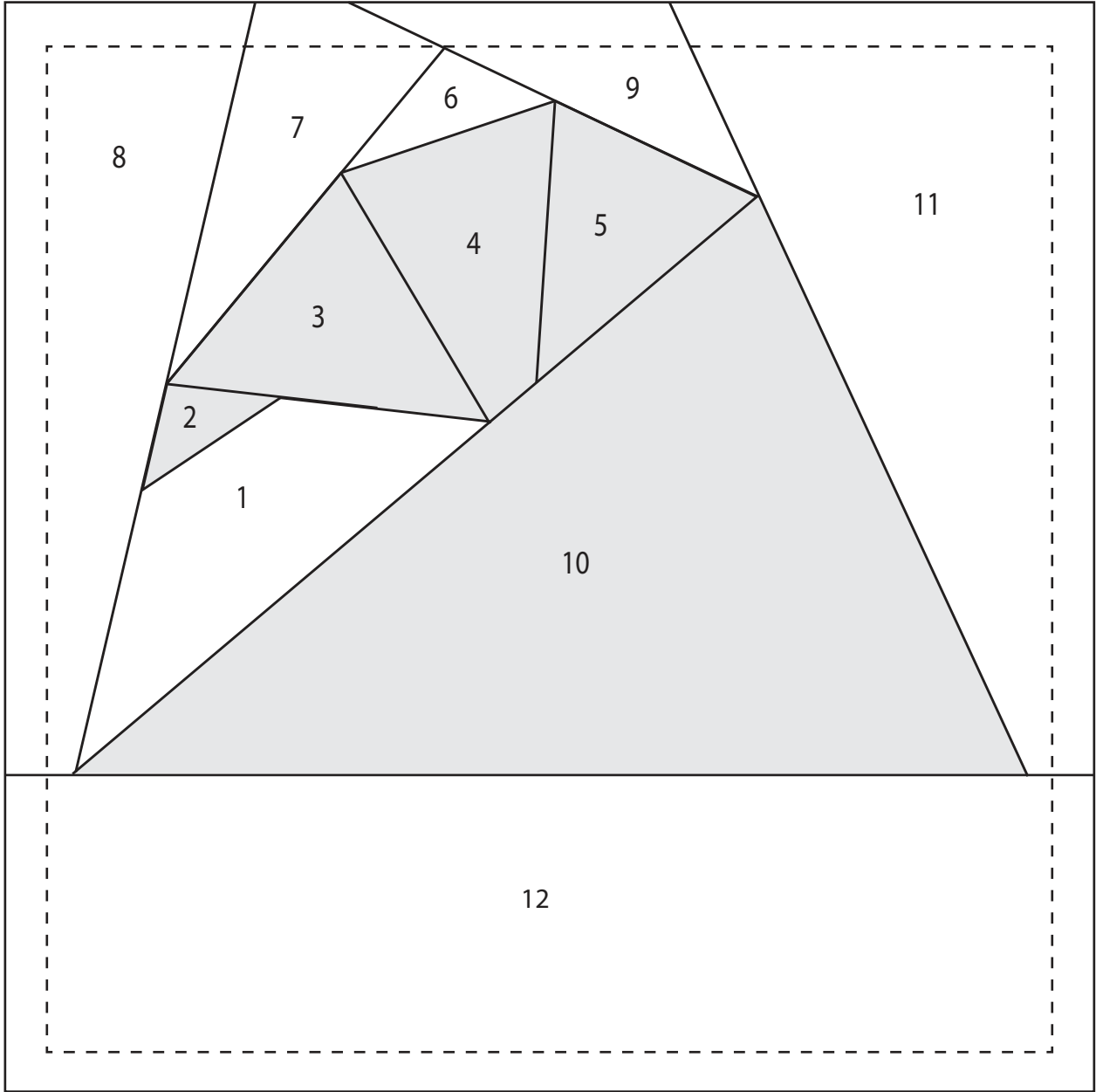
- Two 3" x 2 ½" rectangles for #3 and #5
- One 7" x 9" rectangle for backing

- One 7" x 3" rectangle of Solid Marshmallow White for #12
- One 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle of skin color solid for face appliqué
- One 2 ¼" x WOF strip of **Candy Stripe [R590348D]** fabric for binding
- One 7" x 9" rectangle of batting

### Piecing Instructions:

1. Copy page 2 onto foundation paper at 100% size. Trim away the bottom portion of the pattern and set aside. You only need to paper-piece the hat.
2. Paper-piece the hat in your favorite method. Not familiar with paper-piecing? Need a refresher? Visit [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=\\_D\\_qjpZRuAI&t=27s](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_D_qjpZRuAI&t=27s) or search Youtube for Christmas Elf Mug Rug tutorial by Material Girlfriends for a video tutorial. Then follow these steps.
3. Trace the lines and numbers on the back of the paper. This is to assist you in positioning your fabric.
4. Pre-cut your fabrics. Estimate an inch or more larger than the space it will cover.
5. Start with number one. On the back side of the paper where you drew the lines, pin right side up the fabric piece so it covers the entire area by at least a quarter inch on all sides.
6. Position the fabric for number 2 right sides facing together on top of the fabric for position 1. Check the position. Sew on the line.
7. Trim the seam to ¼" using a postcard to fold the paper over and an Add-A-Quarter ruler. Continue in the same manner until you've covered all the numbered spaces.
8. Trim on the outside solid line and tear away the foundation paper.
9. Cut a background rectangle 2 ½" x 6 ½". Appliqué the face using your favorite method. The sample was done using raw-edge fusible appliqué. Trace the face onto the paper side of double-sided light fusible web. Follow your products directions. Fuse fusible product to the wrong side of skin color fabric and trim out on the line. Trace the nose and mouth with a fabric pen and then heat-set to the right side of the 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle, aligning the face at the top edge of the rectangle. Add a blanket stitch around the curve of the face.
10. Sew the face to the bottom of the hat and give it a good pressing.
11. Quilt and bind. You can add some rosy cheeks with fabric paint or crayon. What about the hat's pom-pom? On one mug rug I traced a quarter on some fusible web and created a pom-pom from some chenille. On another, I sewed a jingle bell. A button, yo-yo or yarn pom-pom would be just as cute! Have fun finishing him up.

## Cutting Instructions

### Background - Gray Naughty List [R590350D]

- Ten 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle for face appliqué
- Five 2" x 6 1/2" rectangle for spacers
- Ten 1 1/2" squares for shoulders

### Hat- Red Garland [R590347D]

- Five 2" x 6 1/2" rectangles for shoulders

### Candy Stripe [R590348D]

- Two 30 1/2" x 1 1/2" rectangles for inner border
- Two 21 1/2" x 1 1/2" rectangles for inner border
- Four 2 1/2" x WOF for binding

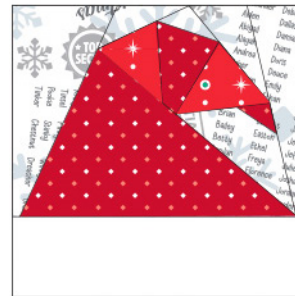
### Hats and Scarfs [R590346D]

- Two 32 1/2" x 3" rectangles for outer border
- Two 26 1/2" x 3" rectangles for outer border
- One 30" x WOF for backing

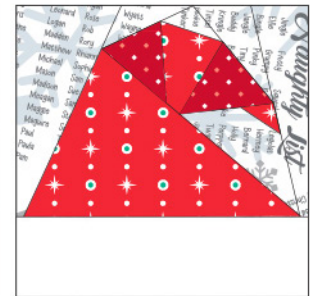
Ten 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles of skin color solids for faces

## Piecing Instructions:

1. Paper-piece 10 hats. Alternate the placement of **Red Garland** and **Red Diamonds** for five of the hats. Trim on the outside line and tear away the foundation paper. Refer to page 2 for paper-piecing instructions.
2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 1 1/2" squares. Position in the upper left and right corners of the 2" x 6 1/2" **Red Garland** rectangle. Sew on the drawn line. Press the lower half of the 1 1/2" square up to the corner. Trim the back two fabrics, 1/4" from the seam, to reduce bulk.
3. Trace the mouth and nose with a fabric pen, and appliqué the face to a 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" **Gray Naughty List** rectangle. Align the face at the top edge of the rectangle. Add a blanket stitch around the curve of the face. Make ten.
4. For **Elf A**, arrange a hat, face, and shoulder units like the diagram. Sew and press seams as indicated by the arrows. Make five. **Elf A** unit should measure 6 1/2" x 10".
5. For **Elf B**, arrange a 2" x 6 1/2" **Gray Naughty List** rectangle, a hat, and face units like the diagram. Sew and press seams as indicated by the arrows. Make five. **Elf B** unit should measure 6 1/2" x 10".

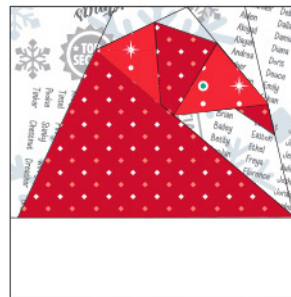

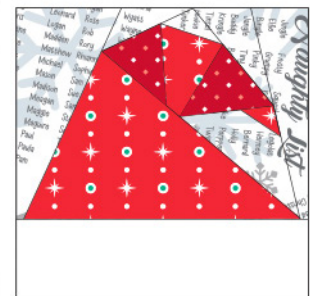

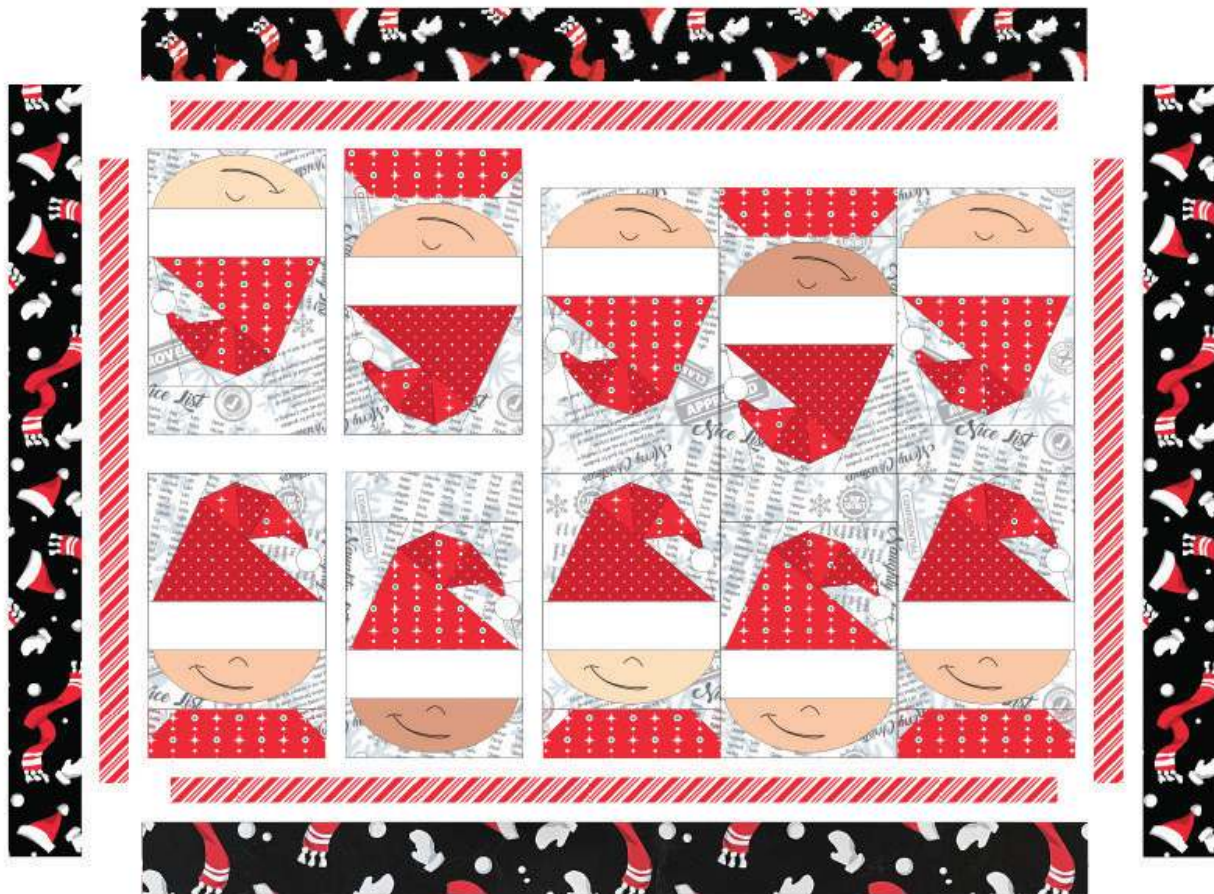

6. Arrange the **Elf A** and **Elf B** units like the diagram. Sew the top elf to the bottom elf, creating vertical rows. Press the seams in alternate directions.
7. Align, pin, and sew the vertical rows together. Press the seams in one direction. Pieced top should measure  $30\frac{1}{2}'' \times 19\frac{1}{2}''$ .
8. Align, pin, and sew two **Candy Stripe**  $30\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$  rectangles to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press seams toward the **Candy Stripe**. Align, pin, and sew two **Candy Stripe**  $21\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$  rectangles to the left and right sides of the quilt top.
9. Align, pin, and sew two **Hats and Scarfs**  $32\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3''$  rectangles to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press seams toward the outer border. Align, pin, and sew two **Hats and Scarfs**  $26\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3''$  rectangles to the left and right sides. Press seams toward the outer border.
10. Quilt and bind. You can add some rosy cheeks with fabric paint or crayon. Get creative with the hats' pom-poms. Trace a quarter on fusible web and created a pom-pom from some chenille, or sew on jingle bells, button, yo-yo, or yarn pom-poms. Have fun!
