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3YD Quebec

Quilt Pattern, 38" x 52"

Read ALL instructions before beginning. Blocks are 6" Finished Size.

All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam allowance with fabric right sides together.

This pretty quilt is created by using the same block but in two color layouts. The **Rosebud** block was first documented in the 1930s. Though this version is simplified, it is still a beautiful block that will be enjoyed by guilters today and in the future.

Cutting Instructions

From the Light fabric cut:

Five strips 2 ½" x WOF, sub-cut into seventy-two 2 ½" squares One strip 4 ½" x WOF, sub-cut into twelve 4 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles Ten strips 1 ½" x WOF, sub-cut into fifty-eight 1 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

From the Medium fabric cut:

One strip 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF, sub-cut into twelve 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and six 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares Two strips 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF, sub-cut into twenty-four 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and six 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares Six strips 3" x WOF for Outer Border




From the Dark fabric cut:


One strip 6 ½" x WOF, sub-cut into twelve 6 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles One strip 4 ½" x WOF, sub-cut into twelve 4 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles One strip 2 ½" x WOF, sub-cut into twelve 2 ½" squares Six strips 2 ½" x WOF for Inner Border Two strips 1 ½" x WOF for Posts, sub-cut into thirty-five 1 ½" squares

To make this a 3 yard quilt pattern, the piece cutting is tight! Below is a cutting map for your reference. Cutting is from left to right in the order as listed above.

Rosebud Block Construction

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of forty-eight Light 2 ½" squares.
- 2. Position a 2 ½" square, right sides together, with the Dark 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangle as shown in the diagram. Sew on the line. Trim the corner exess 1/4" from the sewn line. Press the seam as the arrow indicates. Repeat with the Medium 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangle. Make 12 each.



3. Position a 2 ½" square, right sides together, with the Dark 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle as shown in the diagram. Sew on the line. Trim the corner exess 1/4" from the sewn line. Press the seam as the arrow indicates. Repeat with the Medium 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles. Make 12 each.



3. Make 12 of each.

- 4. Align and sew a Medium 2 ½" square to a Light 2 ½" square. Press the seam as the arrow indicates.






5. Align, pin, and sew a Medium 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangle to the left side of the block. Press the seam as the arrow indicates.

7. Rosebud A block 6 1/2" square, make 12.

- 6. Align, pin, and sew a Dark/Light 2 ½" x 4 ½" unit to the right side of the block. Press the seam as the arrow indicates.
- 7. Align, pin, and sew a Dark/Light 2 ½" x 6 ½" unit to the bottom of the block. Press the seam as the arrow indicates. Block should measure 6 1/2" square. Repeat the steps to make a total of twelve **Rosebud A** blocks.
- 8. Repeat the same steps to create twelve Rosebud B blocks. Sew a Dark 2 ½" square to a Light 2 1/2" square. Sew a Light 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangle to the left side of the block. Sew a Medium/Light













2 ½" x 4 ½" unit to the right side. Sew a Medium/Light 2 ½" x 6 ½" unit to the bottom of the block. Press seams as the arrow indicates. Blocks should measure 6 ½" square.

Rosebud B block 6 ½" square,make 12.











- 9. Arrange four **Rosebud** A blocks, four Light 1 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles, and one 1 ½" Dark square like the diagram.
- 10. Sew the top three pieces together. Sew the middle three pieces together. Sew the bottom three pieces together. Press the seams as the arrows indicate.
- 11. Nest seams, pin, and sew the three rows together. Press the seams as the arrows indicate. Make three **Rosebud A** blocks.
- 12. Repeat the same process to create three **Rosebud B** blocks. Blocks should measure 13 ½" square.


Quilt Top Assembly

- 1. Create the Vertical Sashing by sewing a Light 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the top and bottom of one 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Dark square. Make nine sets. Vertical Sashing unit should measure 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Press the seams toward the Dark square.
- 2. Create the Horizontal Sashing by sewing five Dark 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and four Light 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles alternating positions like the diagram. Make four sets. Horizontal Sashing unit should measure 29 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Press the seams toward the Dark squares.





3. Arrange the Vertical and Horizontal Sashing units with the **Rosebud A** and **Rosebud B** blocks like the diagram on page 4. Nest seams, pin, and sew the Vertical Sashing and the Rosebud blocks in the first row together. Press the seams as the arrows indicate. Repeat for the other two rows.



4. Nest seams, pin, and sew the Horizontal Sashing and the Rosebud Block rows together.

Inner Border

5. Press the quilt top well before adding the borders (hot iron but no steam). The quilt top should measure $29 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $43 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Measure the length of the left and right sides of your quilt top. In a perfect quilter's world, the measurement would be $43 \frac{1}{2}$ ". If the sides of your quilt top are different, average the measurements.

Trim off the selvage, and sew two Dark 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips end-to-end. With the seam in the center, measure and trim to your length measurement (43 $\frac{1}{2}$ "). Pin the strip at the ends and middle, then pin and ease any differences. Sew to the left and right sides of the quilt top. Press the seams toward the border.


6. Measure the width of the top and bottom of your quilt top. In a perfect quilter's world, the measurement would be 33 ½". If the sides of your quilt top are different, average the measurements.

Trim off the selvage, measure and trim two Dark 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to your top and bottom measurement (33 $\frac{1}{2}$ "). Pin the strip at the ends and middle first, then pin and ease any differences. Sew to the top and bottom of your quilt top. Press seams toward the Inner border.

Outer Border

- 7. Repeat the process to add the 3" Medium Outer border. Measure, trim border sets, pin, and sew to the left and right sides (47 ½" in a quilter's perfect world).
- 8. Measure, trim border sets, pin, and sew the Outer border strips sets to the top and bottom (38 $\frac{1}{2}$ " in a quilter's perfect world). Press seams toward the Outer border. Quilt top should measure 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Great job! Quilt, bind, and enjoy!

Binding: 1/2 YD




